2018 Restorative Practices in Schools Trainings: Registration is Now Open

The Minnesota Department of Education School Safety Technical Assistance Center will offer two weeks of restorative practices training in three different Minnesota locations this coming June. Restorative practices is an approach schools can use to improve school climate and reduce discipline disparities. It focuses on building relationships and creating community in school to prevent harm and to repair relationships. The trainings are open to school administrators, school board members, teachers, educational aides, school resource officers, student support staff, out-of-school time staff, youth workers, school volunteers and community partners. Sessions offered range from introductory level trainings to advanced level trainings.

Cloquet: June 11-15

Register for the Cloquet trainings. In partnership with Cloquet Public Schools Area Alternative Education Program, the center will offer eleven trainings, including: Foundations of Restorative Practices, Circle Training, Conferencing to Repair Harm, School Mediation/Conflict Coaching, Circle Keeper Training, Whole School Design, Mindfulness, ACES, Living Through the Heart, Breaking the School to Prison Pipeline and Restorative Reiki.

Bemidji: June 12-15

Register for the Bemidji trainings. In partnership with Peacemaker Resources, the center will offer six trainings, including: Foundations of Restorative Practices, Circle Training, Restorative Language and Chats, Adverse Childhood Experiences Study, Mindfulness and Circle to Repair Harm.
