





Districts participated SW-PBIS 2 year Training Cohorts 1-10 (2005-2016)




Districts with 60% or more of schools



Number of PBIS Schools in Minnesota










Number of PBIS schools (Green) Implementing, (Red) Measuring Fidelity and (Blue) at Tier I fidelity by state







Enrollment/Disciplinary Action Disparities






Disciplinary Incident Rates per 100 Student by Race/Ethnicity
